"Some of the recent items that the Auxiliary has helped fund are the new sound system in the Chapel, assistive individual hearing devices, defibrillators, a recreational woodworking table for rehabilitation and also a hygiene chair," says Robin Thorstenson, Director of Volunteer Services.

Today, the St. Alexius Medical Center Auxiliary, open to women and men, continues to be a leader in healthcare philanthropy in the Bismarck-Mandan community.

The Auxiliary's primary source of revenue is the volunteer operation of the medical center gift shop, open seven days per week. As a result, all proceeds from the gift shop are contributed towards projects enhancing patient welfare.

Auxiliary members also share their time and talents to create a healing environment within the medical center. From "welcoming" blankets for new babies, to tray favors for patients in the hospital over holidays, the Auxiliary members stay very busy within the medical center.

Your Donation Makes a Larger Impact Through Corporate Matching

One of the easiest ways to increase your gift to the St. Alexius Medical Center Foundation is through your employer's Matching Gift program. Thousands of companies, including corporations, foundations, not-for-profit organizations and associations, match their employees' charitable contributions; sometimes for as much as double the amount of the initial gift.

Companies have various methods for matching gift request submissions: online forms, automated phone systems or a paper form that you submit to the St. Alexius Foundation. Many companies will match personal gifts, such as cash, stocks, marketable securities and the value of your volunteer time. Companies may also match gifts from employee spouses, retirees and board members.

Here's how to take part:

- 1. Contact your employer's Human Resources office to determine if your company matches employee donations. If your company does not currently match employee donations, you might suggest they consider doing so.
- 2. Obtain a Matching Gift form and review the program guidelines to ensure that the St. Alexius Medical Center Foundation is eligible to receive matching gifts. Conditions and criteria for gift matching vary by employer.
- 3. Complete the donor section of the form and submit it, along with your contribution to the Foundation.


